



The DET Grant is provided to enable the AFTV Committee to offer Student Activity Subsidies, Teacher Funding Grants, and a range of professional development opportunities for Primary and Secondary Teachers of French.

The ongoing support of DET plays a vital role in assisting the AFTV in supporting the Teachers and Students of French in Victoria.

French teachers took the opportunity to progress their professional development. The following amounts were provided to French teaching professional development service providers:

- \$2,200 was provided to subsidise language maintenance classes for teachers at Tête-à-Tête.

During FY 2023, the Conference was held over two days at the University of Melbourne and in May there was the Immersion Weekend. Details of these events are in the Sub-committee reports.

Subsidies and grants of up to \$1000 (for government schools) and \$500 (for non-government schools) were again available to cover student activities, professional learning registration fees and language maintenance, in accordance with directives from DET.



# Reports from convenors of sub-committees

# 1. THE LUME, Sunday 30 April, 2023

40 members and guests gathered to meet Monet and Friends featuring works by Manet, Monet, Renoir, Degas, Morisot, Cassatt, Sisley, Signac, Cézanne, Caillebotte, Lautrec... sights, sounds, tastes and aromas combining to see art in a new light, where light was such an integral component of their works. As we crossed the Giverny bridge the walls came alive with projections of both old friends and some less familiar works. Many came as a prelude to organizing a school excursion and others to simply immerse themselves in this unique sensory experience- enjoy the art works, the music, and perhaps the French flavours on offer at the Café de Flore.

2. **MELBOURNE WINTER MASTERPIECES EXHIBITION,** Pierre Bonnard: Designed by India Mahdavi, Sunday 23 July, 2023

47 members and guests gathered at the National Gallery of Victoria to attend this exhibition featuring more than 100 works by Pierre Bonnard (1867-1947). Celebrated for his domestic interiors, natural landscapes and urban scenes and renowned for his use of colour, especially when he and his life-companion, Marthe Bonnard moved to Le Cannet in the south of France. Curated by Paris's Musée d'Orsay in partnership with the NGV, the exhibition brought late 19th and early 20th century France to life through paintings, drawings, prints, photographs and decorative objects by Pierre Bonnard and some of his contemporaries.

Dr Ted Gott, Senior Curator of International Art, gave an insightful and informative lecture in French to introduce the exhibition prior to lunch and some networking with colleagues and friends enjoying French themed individual lunch bags in the Great Hall.

Paris-based architect and designer India Mahdavi showcased Pierre Bonnard's works in an innovative environment that complemented his use of colour and texture to create a feeling of domesticity. Amongst our group there were mixed reactions to India's scenography causing much animated discourse. It was certainly worth every aspect of the visit- well organised, well catered, well timed and well supported.

We look forward to 2025 when another French Exhibition will be staged and the AFTV will once again enjoy the hospitality and generosity of spirit that supports our involvement in French at the NGV.



# 3. Chagall Sunday 29 October 2023

This exhibition at the Jewish Museum of Australia in Alma Rd, St Kilda celebrated the story of an international master, amongst the greatest artists of the twentieth century, Marc Chagall (1887-1985). The curator Jade Nik 's inspired vision included over 100 original works- paintings, stained glass, illustrated poems, etchings, engravings, woodcuts and more.

With 40 bookings, the first 5 to book and attend were refunded their registration.

On this our first event at this venue we thank the exuberant James Perini for his informative commentary and the museum staff for their welcome, efficient organisation and for giving us the opportunity to see and learn so much about this artist, his name and influence held by many alongside Picasso, Matisse and Monet.

The sub-committee met once a term on average to plan and prepare professional learning events. The following events took place in 2023:

**AFTV PD: Nailing It! Assessing VCE French Units 1 & 3** | Friday 17 February | 46 participants Prepared and presented by Lucie Dickens and Nathalie Marchand. The aim of the event was to equip VCE French teachers with the tools to better understand the requirements of Units 1 and 3 French and to collaboratively produce appropriate assessments for these units. ## Finance

Early in 2023. Department of Education funding was granted and the Association maintained its healthy financial situation. Funding was also made available for languages teacher training and coaching in the early years sector. The Association increased its investment in members by funding some members to attend the AFMLTA conference in Perth.

### Membership
