



During the financial year ending 30 September 2024 (FY2024 the AFTV received a grant of \$33,000 from Department of Education and Training (DET) as part of the 'Language-Specific Teacher Associations Grants' (the DET Grant).

The DET Grant is provided to enable the AFTV Committee to offer Student Activity Subsidies, Teacher Funding Grants, and a range of professional development opportunities for Primary and Secondary Teachers of French.

The ongoing support of DET plays a vital role in assisting the AFTV in supporting the Teachers and Students of French in Victoria.

The Profit and Loss Statement and Balance Sheet as produced by the AFTV accounting package, SAASU, follow.

As of 30 September 2024, the AFTV Westpac bank accounts had the following balances:

#### Finance and Scholarship Sub-Committee

French teachers took the opportunity to progress their professional development. The following amounts were provided to French teaching professional development service providers:

- \$3,200 was provided to subsidise online language maintenance classes for teachers at Almaje Language School.
- \$1950.00 was provided to subsidise language maintenance classes for teachers at French Tête-à-Tête.

Subsidies and grants were increased from \$1000 to \$1500 (for government schools) and from \$500 to \$750 (for non-government schools). They were available to cover student activities, professional learning registration fees and language maintenance, in accordance with directives from DET.

# Reports from convenors of sub-committees





Cultural/PL Event 1: Sunday 19 May - Excursion to Bendigo for the exhibition:

Paris: Impressions of Life 1880-1925

23 AFTV Members and Guests experienced our 3 part excursion- an introductory lecture at the Latrobe Art Institute delivered by Delphine Laboreau-Ormancey, (Tête-à-Tête), On View café's French themed lunch and then of course the exhibition itself.

Delphine introduced the exhibition explaining the story and development of Paris during La Belle Époque (and a bit beyond) via the 7 themed rooms. Once entering the exhibition we progressed through bustling marketplaces, Parisian Gardens, the Seine for leisure and industrial development as well as rooms devoted to the Universal Exhibition, the Eiffel Tower, the Bohemian life of Montmartre, the Champs Elysées and the Musée Carnavalet, the source of the wealth of material for this exhibition. The Impressionist painter Jean Béraud's depiction of the entry to the Universal Exhibition 1889 was chosen for the BAG's publicity poster. Other significant artworks- shop signs, paintings by Maurice Utrillo and Paul Signac, prints and posters by Toulouse-Lautrec and his contemporaries plus clothing and accessories reinforced the story.

Special thanks to subcommittee members Claire Cowen who introduced Delphine and Veronica Deren who thanked her for her presentation.



#### Cultural/PL Event 2: Sunday 4 August

#### The LUME- Leonardo da Vinci – 500 Years of Genius

30 members and guests visited the Lume at the Melbourne Convention and Exhibition Centre to visit this exhibition dedicated to exploring the life of the greatest creative genius the world has ever known, Leonardo da Vinci, arguably the Lume's most ambitious, immersive and breathtaking experience yet. (Such a pity that this venue will close in 2026)

Via the wall projections we entered Leonardo's life beginning in his birthplace, Vinci, and ending in Amboise, France, where he spent the last 20 years of his life, selling his masterpiece, the Mona Lisa, to his friend François 1; we visited Italian cities -Florence, Venice, Milan, where he worked and developed his talents. Works by other significant Italian artists such as Michelangelo, Titian, Botticelli, Raphael, Caravaggio, Giotto followed, plus an analysis of Leonardo's restored The Last Supper.

The room Mona Lisa Revealed was devoted to the work of French Optical Engineer consultant to The Louvre Museum, Pascal Cotte, whose ongoing discoveries have revealed previously hidden details of La Joconde.

As an artist, inventor, scientist, philosopher, musician, costume designer, his insatiable curiosity spanning anatomy, engineering, flying machines, hydraulic systems, architecture, engineering, flight and war machinery were featured in the upstairs gallery and in some rare original pages from his Codex Atlanticus notebooks.



#### Cultural/PL Event 3: Friday 6 December

#### Rue de Thanh, Vietnamese Restaurant, 406 Brunswick St Fitzroy

This time it was Vietnamese with a French twist for our annual Francophone end of year celebration dinner. A sold out group of 26 members and guests gathered to enjoy each other's company, a delicious meal of a wide variety of dishes, and to cap it off, an informative and interesting talk on the French Connection delivered by our welcoming and helpful host Tran.

For this memorable experience guests purchased their own drinks at the bar and the AFTV subsidised the meal cost for members. Entrées were served on platters with one each of the choices, mains were served separately to be shared so that everyone had the opportunity to sample a wide variety of mains, and desserts came individually. Prior to dessert Thanh(Tran) gave a short talk on the French Connection mentioning the Chinese origin of the Vietnamese language, in script form and, with the arrival of the French, the romanisation of the language. He gave details of the heritage left by the French such as the language where once all children learned French at school. The heritage also remains in architecture, the railways and the ubiquitous baguette!

Merci Tran and thanks to Marie Pépin for her words of appreciation. A very successful and happy event appreciated by all. My special thanks to Kyla Vaz who sourced this relatively new restaurant and to those on the committee who supported this venture.



### 2024 AFTV AGM - SLA / MLTAV

#### **Finance**

The MLTAV maintained its healthy financial situation, projecting a break even position the 2023-4 year and then making a profit. The proposed budget for the 2024-25 year was approved. As an organisation that earns under \$500,000 per annum, the MLTAV is no longer required to submit an audit (Consumer Affairs Victoria rules). Therefore, the financial data will be presented as a report at the AGM. DET grants funded a number of exciting projects, eg, 'Building Languages Leaders'.

### Membership

Membership increased steadily in 2024, up to a total of 767 individual members at the end of October. Membership rates are to remain the same.

### Ideas

The Association reviewed and updated its rules, as the last update was in 2016. This included a name change to Language Teachers Victoria.

Some of MLTAV's online presence was moved from 'X' to 'Linked In' and a social media officer position was created. Both actions were to boost the presence of the Association and to increase links with the broader educational sector.

### 2024 AFTV AGM - SLA / MLTAV

### Projects and professional learning

- Projects, funded by DET, such as 'Literacy and Languages' and the 'Mentoring project for beginning teachers' continued.
- Further investment in members meant that the 'Inclusive Pedagogies' and 'Gender Just' action-research projects were launched.
- Professional learning events were chosen in response to research carried out at the annual conference (2 December 2023). Inclusive practices in Language Education was a topic for a Professional Learning event. This topic was a focus for the annual conference, held on 29 November.
- Webinars such as Victorian Curriculum for languages 2.0 and Gender Inclusive language teaching were presented.

### 2024 AFTV AGM Student Activities - Films

Investigations about a screening for Senior students of a French film started in April as soon as the French Film festival was over.

The films Divertimento for Senior and Nina et le secret du hérisson for Juniors were available for release in Australia and approved by Palace. The screening of Divertimento took place on Friday 21/06 (end of Term 2) for Senior students and on Friday 26/07 (Start of Term 3) Nina et le secret du Hérisson was shown to the Juniors.

Due to renovations at Collins Place, it was decided not to take any chances with using Kino and COMO was selected as the venue for both films.

For Divertimento, Cinema 2 at Como (176 seats) was selected. Attending were 4 independent schools and 4 government schools, in total 168 students and teachers. It was a bitterly cold day, but the music warmed our hearts!

The film was well received by teachers and students alike.

The next film was screened on Friday 21 July and intended for a junior audience. "Nina et le secret du Hérisson" (Nina and the secret of the Hedgehog) is an animated film, shown at the AFFFF as part of the school screenings. Although, it was advertised early and went live in June well before the end of the term 2, the bookings were slow. Only one private school made a booking in early June for 45 students. The 68-seat cinema was selected, making it a private screening...The film was really beautiful, featuring an intrepid, lovable heroine in an enchanting setting of a sublime forest! Students loved it!

We kept the price of tickets the same as in 2023, \$6 for Government Schools and \$9 for Independent schools. We also would like to remind teachers that a subsidy is available from the AFTV to cover a CRT in Government schools.

At our July 2024 meeting, the AFTV committee decided to add a disclaimer to all AFTV organised films stating that there would be "no refund for non-attending students/absentees on the day" unless unforeseen circumstances.
