

The "is written French still teachable" session was fascinating, but perhaps less immediately relevant. • The conference was, as always, a huge undertaking for the committee and a huge success too so first-of-all: thank you to the committee and Diane, Philippe and Lucie in particular!-I felt really invigorated by the conference. I was considering leaving the profession but the sense of connection and fun really helped me realise how much I love teaching. When working out the program, it would have been good to create some streams: VCE / Primary / Junior school. Some sessions were clashing - they seemed to be aimed at the same audience. • French is a hugely popular language in Victoria due to the quality of French teachers, the availability of the resources, the profile of France on the world scene and the pedagogy teachers use. It would be good to promote this more in the future/ make this more visible. • The conference was great with great presenters and I thoroughly enjoyed being with like minded people, speaking French. It was extremely well organised. I found that I left with fewer ready to go strategies/ideas/resources though compared to the last AFTV conference about 8 years ago. I would have liked fewer theory focused sessions (very interesting though) and more classroom practice oriented sessions like the Conti or Le chant en classe ones.

2022 AFTV AGM – Treasurer’s Report

During the financial year ending 30 September 2022 (FY2022) the AFTV received a grant of \$33,000 from Department of Education and Training (DET) as part of the 'Language-Specific Teacher Associations Grants' (the DET Grant).

The DET Grant is provided to enable the AFTV Committee to offer: Student Activity Subsidies, Teacher Funding Grants and a range of professional development opportunities for Primary and Secondary Teachers of French.

The ongoing support of DET plays a vital role in assisting the AFTV in supporting the Teachers and Students of French in Victoria.

The Profit and Loss Statement and Balance Sheet as produced by the AFTV accounting package, SAASU, are attached.

As at 30 September 2022, the AFTV Westpac bank accounts had the following balances:

Finance and Scholarship Sub-Committee


